



## The Third Missionary Journey Continues Acts 20

### Introduction

Leaving Ephesus following the “riot,” Paul travels to Troas in the hopes of finding Titus and getting a report on how the Corinthians had received his first letter (2 Cor. 2:12-13). Unsuccessful, Paul leaves for Macedonia, then for Corinth. Paul finally decides to return to Syria, but not before calling the Ephesian elders to him at Miletus to give a parting exhortation. On this last “leg” of the journey, Paul writes 2 letters.

### Labors In Macedonia (20:1)

- 1) Following the “Ephesian uproar,” what did Paul do? (vv. 1-2a) Exactly where did he go after leaving Ephesus and for what reason? (2 Cor. 2:12-13; 7:5-7)

### Labors In Achaia & Greece (20:2-3)

- 2) Where does Paul arrive following his travels through Macedonia? (v. 2b) How long did he stay? (v. 3a)
- 3) What happened that forced him to act? (v. 3b)

### Return Trip To Syria (20:4-38)

- 4) Who is listed as traveling with Paul? (v. 4) Where were they? (v. 5a) What else do you notice that is important in vv. 5b-6a? (cp. 16:23, 40; 17:1)
- 5) Where does Paul travel in v. 6b? What is recorded in v. 7? Why is this verse important?
