



The Journey To Rome Begins Acts 27

Introduction

The time for Paul to go to Rome has come...nothing more can be done for him in Caesarea because of his appeal to the emperor (*Nero*). Being late in the year (*when most travels on the open seas did not happen*), the journey will not be an easy one. Luke's record in this chapter and the next one will bear this out. The shipwreck will be nothing this apostle had not already endured for the cause of Christ (**cp. 2 Cor. 11:25**).

The Journey To Rome (27:1-44)

- 1) What "decision" was made in v. 1a? Notice again the pronoun used...who is still with Paul? What arrangements were made re: Paul's trip? (v. 1b)

- 2) What was the "initial leg" of the journey to Rome? (vv. 2-3) Besides Luke, who else traveled with Paul? Where have we previously read of him? (19:29)

- 3) Plot the journey after they sailed from Syria. (vv. 4-5) What did the centurion in charge of Paul do in Myra? (v. 6) What was their "route" from there? (vv. 7-8)

- 4) What did Paul advise in vv. 9-10? Was he influential enough? (v. 11) What "route" was chosen next? (vv. 12-13)
