

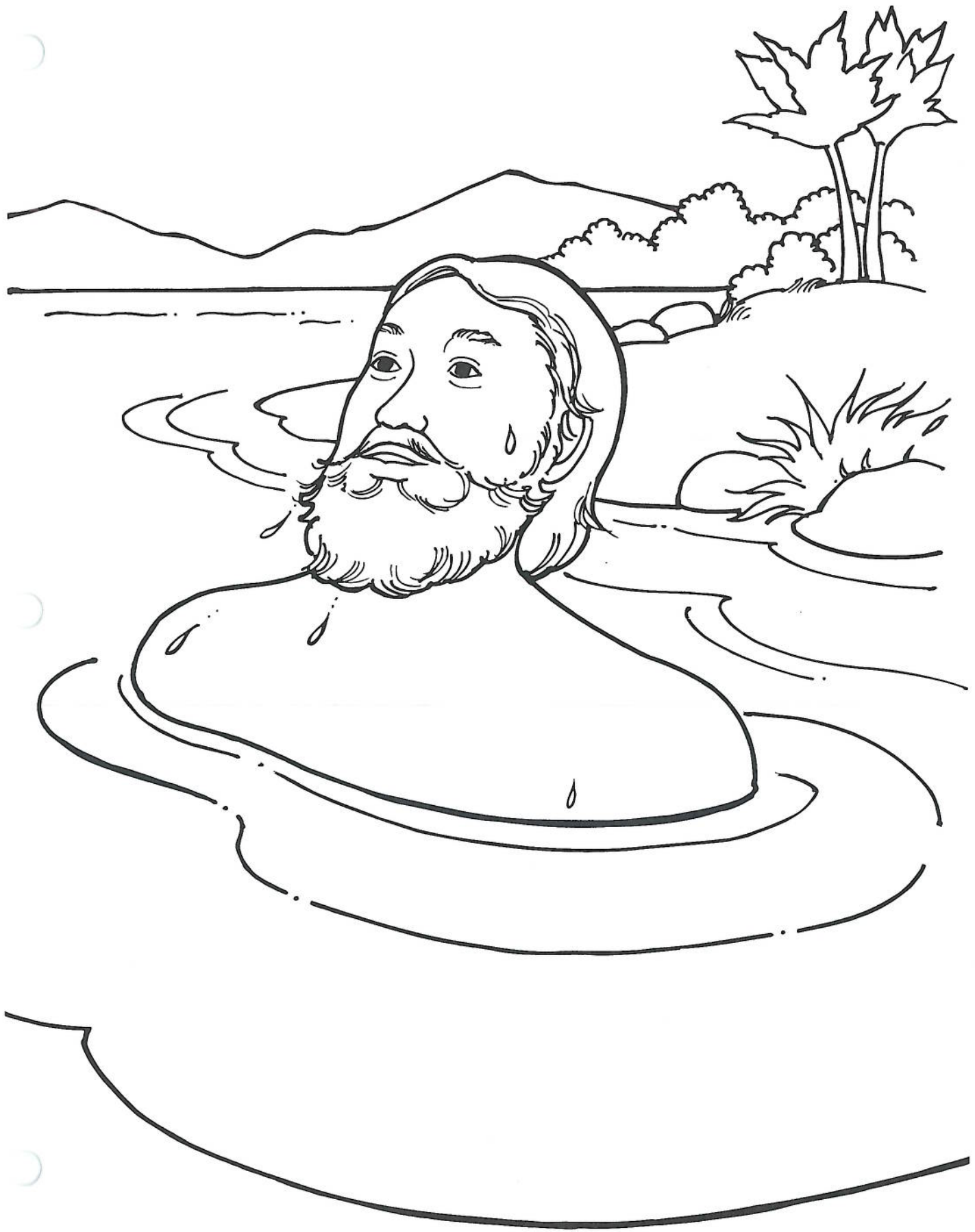
107. NAAMAN'S LEPROSY IS HEALED

"So he went down and dipped seven times in the Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God; and his flesh was restored like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean."

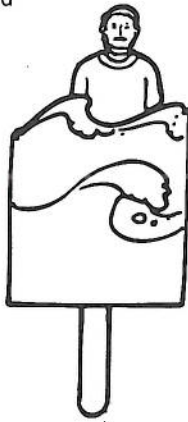

2 Kings 5—God Heals an Obedient Naaman Naaman Story Puppets

Supplies

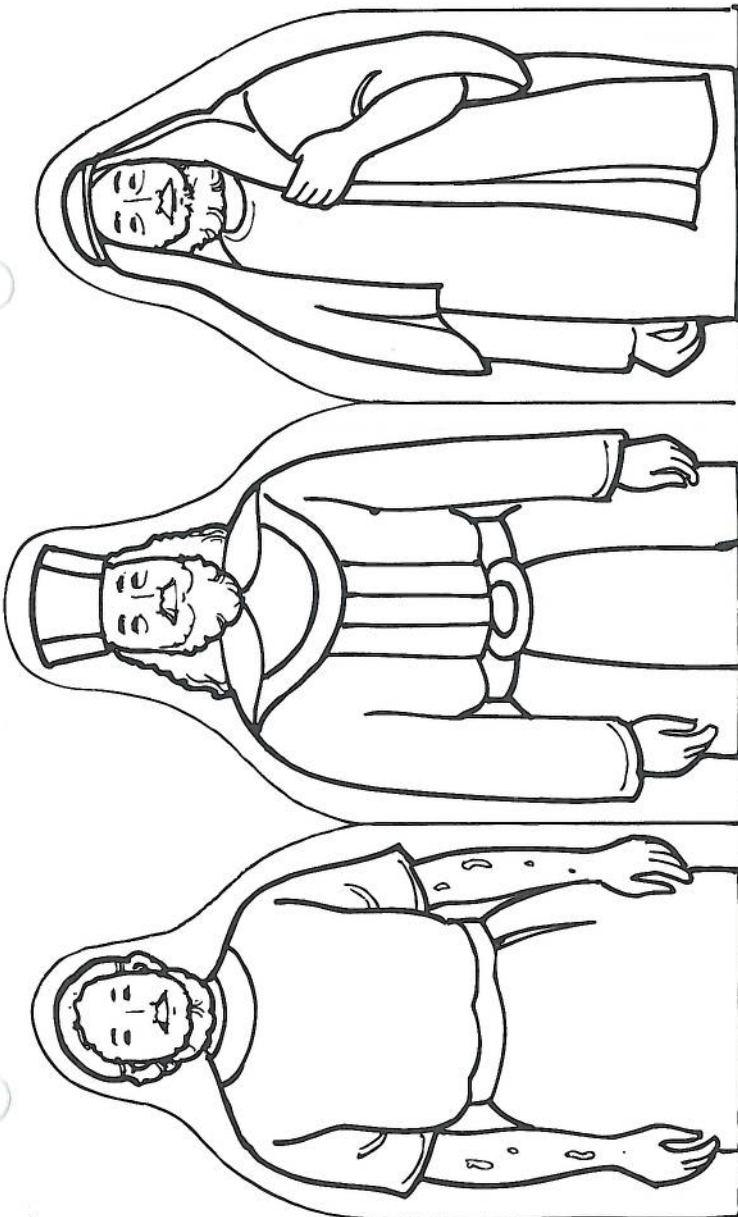
copies of the puppets for each child
 crayons or markers
 blue construction paper
 scissors
 craft sticks (4 per child)
 glue



Directions

Color and cut out the puppets and the outfits. Attach a craft stick to each of the puppets (but not the outfits) by gluing the stick to the back bottom of each figure. Cut a piece of blue construction paper to look like water. Attach a craft stick to the back bottom of the water piece (see the example). Use the puppets and the water piece to retell the story of God healing Naaman:

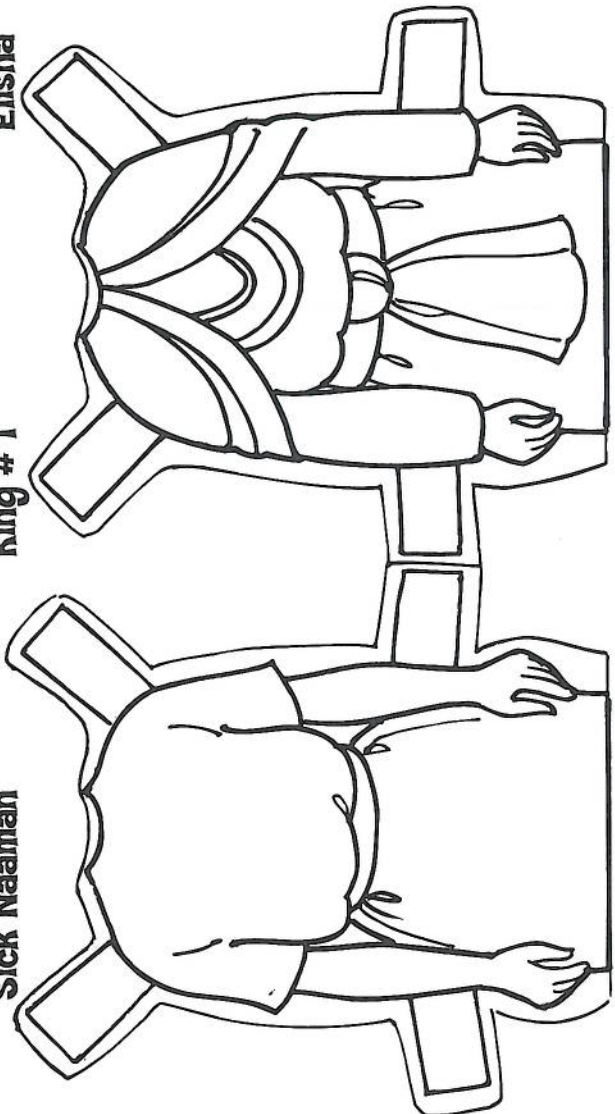
- 1) Naaman had a terrible disease. He told the king about a prophet who could heal him (show Naaman and the king).
- 2) The king sent Naaman to another king closer to where the prophet lived (put king outfit on the king puppet to show this was a different king).
- 3) The prophet Elisha sent a message to the king asking for Naaman to come to him. Naaman went to see Elisha (show Naaman and Elisha puppets).
- 4) Elisha told Naaman to go and dip in the Jordan River seven times and he would be healed (show Naaman going behind the water piece seven times).
- 5) When Naaman came out of the water, he was healed (put the outfit on Naaman to show that his skin was healed).
