Exhortations On How Those Who Are "Free In Christ" Should Live (Gal. 5:1 – 6:18)

Introduction

As with most of Paul's letters, the final section is the application...it is how saints are to put into practice the doctrine set forth earlier in the epistle. Re: Paul's letter to the Galatian churches, Christians must demonstrate they are led by the Spirit they had been given (4:6), and not that they were living by law.

It is simply not enough for one to claim he/she is a child of God. One must bear the Spirit's fruit to be a child of God according to the promises given to Abraham, the "father" of believers. This final section **(Gal. 5-6)** not only contains the 3rd and final proposition **(5:1)**, it also teaches how saints can show by their fruits they are indeed "free children." Paul shows this by discussing various situations saints face.
