Lesson 4: Jesus Christ – Greater Than Moses

2. Since both Moses and Christ were faithful to the One who appointed them, why is Christ counted worthy of more glory than Moses (3:2-3; cf. Matthew 16:18)
3. From Hebrews 3:5-6, what is the difference between the position of Moses and the position of Christ relative to the house?
 - Moses’ work in God’s house served as a testimony for what?
 - We are Christ’s house IF we do what?
4. In Hebrews 3:6, who is cited as the source of the quotation from Psalm 95?
What truth concerning the inspiration of Scripture does this confirm? (cf. 2 Peter 1:21).
5. What did the Israelites do to their hearts in the day of rebellion in the wilderness that we are not to do? (3:8)
 - What did they do to God? (3:9)
 - What did they see as a result? (3:9)
 - What did the Lord give as the reason for His anger with that generation? (3:10)
 - What did the Lord swear they would not enter? (3:11)
6. Of what should we beware? (3:12)
 - To whom is this admonition directed? (3:1)
 - Is it possible to depart from a place where one has never been?
7. Why should we exhort one another (3:13)
 - When and how often should we exhort one another? (3:13, 15)
 - Give an example of how the deceitfulness of sin can harden a person.
8. We have become partakers with Christ, IF we do what? (3:14)
9. Who, having heard, rebelled? (3:16)
10. With whom was the Lord angry forty years? (3:17)
11. To whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest? (3:18)
12. So we see that they could not enter in to rest because of what? (3:19)
