## Lesson Seven Study Questions – Cleansing Lepers

(Matthew 8:2-4; Mark 1:40-45; Luke 5:12-16; 17:11-19)

1. What were some of the symptoms of leprosy according to Leviticus 13:1-30?
  - What was a leprosy person required to do according to Leviticus 13:45-46?
  - What was the basic procedure for determining that one had been healed of leprosy? (see Leviticus 14:1-32)
  - Give the names of two prominent Israelites who were stricken with leprosy and had to be isolated. (Numbers 12:9-15; 2 Chronicles 26:19-21)
2. According to Jesus, how many lepers did Elisha heal? (Luke 4:27)
  - What are we to conclude from this about God's purpose for miracles in general and for healing lepers in particular? Was His intention to cure all lepers?
  - Who else was given power to heal lepers? (Matthew 10:8)
3. How extensive was the case of leprosy of the man who came to be healed in Luke 5:12?
  - What did this man do as he approached Christ to ask for healing? (Luke 5:12; Mark 1:40; Matthew 8:2)
  - What did he say to Jesus?
4. Notice precisely how Jesus responded to the man. (Mark 1:41)
  - What emotion did Jesus have?
  - What did Jesus do?
  - What did Jesus say?
  - How soon was the man healed?
  - What three things did Jesus charge the man to do in Luke 5:14?
  - In what way would showing himself to the priests serve "as a testimony" to them?
5. Why did Jesus tell the man not to tell everyone about being healed?
  - Just after performing many miracles and being informed that everyone was looking for Him, what did Jesus say in Mark 1:38?
  - What was the consequence of the man freely telling others about his healing? (Mark 1:45)
6. What did ten lepers lift up their voices and say to Jesus? (Luke 17:11-13)
  - What did Jesus say to them? (Luke 17:14)
  - What happened "as they went"?
  - When one of them, a Samaritan, saw that he was cleansed, what did he do and say? (Luke 17:15-16)
  - What made this leper well? (Luke 17:19)
    - In what way had this man shown his faith?
