As had happened in Galilee, Jesus comes under scrutiny in Perea for His willingness to associate with the "tax gatherers and sinners." To combat this prejudice, Jesus tells 3 three parables in succession. These stories emphasize the value of each lost soul, the love of the Father who agonizes over their departure, and the ugly bias of those who think themselves better than the ones who are "lost."

#### Parable Of The Prodigal Son (15:11-32)
