- Godliness
 - Literally "piety"
 - Reverence and devotion to God
 - Used by Paul and Peter
 - 1 Tim: 2:2; 2:10; 3:16; 4:7; 4:8; 6:3; 6:5; 6:6; 6:11
 - 2 Tim: 3:5
 - Titus 1:1
 - 2 Peter: 1:3; 1:6; 1:7; 3:11



Defining Our Terms

- Contentment
 - A state of mind where you feel that what you have is sufficient. Luke 3:14;
 Philippians 4:11; 1 Tim 6:8; Heb 13:5;
 3 John 1:10



So What is Great Gain?

Living a life with reverence and devotion to God, and being satisfied that what you have is sufficient.



Why?

- "For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out." – 1 Tim 6:7
 - We cannot take anything material with us
 Job 1:21
 - But we can have an incorruptible treasure
 Matt 6:19-20; Gal 6:7-8; 2 Tim 4:7-8;

Prov 11:4



Why?

- We can have something that eludes much of the world
 - We can have contentment
 - And confidence that "God will provide" –
 Gen. 22:8
 - Philippians 4:11; Matt 6:25-34;
 Prov 16:16-17; Eccl 4:6; Eccl 5:10-17



Why?

 We can avoid many of the miseries of this life – 1 Tim 6:9-10; Gal 6:7-8



Defining Some More Terms

- Love of money Philarguria
 - Love a deep, affectionate love.
 - The kind of love and affection that a woman would have for her husband and children. Titus 2:3-4
 - Money Literally "silver"
- Materialism "An interest in and desire for money, possessions, etc, rather than spiritual or ethical values" -- World English Dictionary



Defining Some More Terms

- "all evil"
 - All kinds of, or some of all types of, evil
 - All the major branches of worldliness.
 1 John 2:16



Defining Our Terms

- "all evil"
 - Examples
 - Lying Ananias and Sapphira Acts 5:1-10
 - Stealing Achan Joshua 7
 - Betrayal Judas
 - Murder Ahab and Jezebel 1 Kings 21
 - Selfishness Nabal, 1 Sam 25, and the Rich Man of Luke 16



Materialism

- One of Satan's most productive snares
 - Materialism appeals on so many levels –
 1 John 2:16
 - Lust of the flesh James 4:3
 - Lust of the eyes "When I saw..." Joshua 7:21
 - Pride of life So many people define themselves, and others, by their possessions
 - Satan even tried to use materialism to tempt Jesus – Matt. 4:8-10



- Personal 2 Tim 6:9-10
 - God has never accepted divided loyalty
 - No man can serve two masters. God requires our full commitment –

Matt 6:19-34; Rev 3:16-17

- We will make a choice. There is no middle ground – Joshua 24:14-15; 1 Kings 18:21; Matt 19:16-24
- Materialism will make us idolaters Col 3:5



- Personal
 - It will choke the word of God out of our hearts (Matt 13:3-8, 18-23; 2 Tim 4:10), and cost us our faith (Rom 10:17)
 - Materialism will make us trade the eternal for the corruptible – Matt 16:26; Luke 12:15-21; Matt 6:19-20
 - Reliance on the material will blind us to our spiritual needs – Rev 3:17



- Personal
 - Materialism robs us of contentment and satisfaction – James 4:1-3
 - It draws us away from sound doctrine –
 2 Tim 4:3-4
 - We give things and people power over us
 1 Cor 6:12
 - We cannot escape the consequences Gal 6:7-8



- Family Eph 6:4; Eph 5:25, 28-33
 - Materialism takes precious time from family
 - Spouse Eph 5:29
 - Children Eph 6:4
 - It robs children of a good example
 - Examples: Achan, Nabal, David,
 Solomon, Ananias and Sapphira



- Church
 - Materialism robs churches of workers –
 2 Tim. 4:10
 - It affects attendance Matt 13:3-8, 18-23
 - It affects the contribution 2 Cor 9:7
 - Ultimately it compromises the ability of the church to fulfill its mission



- Contentment
 - Am I content?
 - Where do I seek contentment/happiness?
 - Where are my priorities:
 - In spending my time?
 - In choosing my friends?
 - In choosing my career?
 - What kind of people do I date?



- Am I selfish? Gal 6:9-10; James 1:27;
 1 John 3:17; Eccl 11:1-2; Psalm 41:1
- What am I willing to do to get what I want?
- What would I do to keep what I have?
 Matt 19:16-22
- What place do my possessions occupy in my life?
- What impresses me? James 2:1-4



- Is it wrong to want to provide well for my family? 1 Tim 5:8; 2 Thess 3:10
- Is Matt 6:25-34 saying I'm materialistic if I plan for the future? Prov 6:6-11; Prov 10:4-5; Prov 20:4; Prov 31:10-31; James 4:13-16; Luke 12:16-21
- It is not wrong to enjoy God's blessings
 - Eccl 2:24-26; Eccl 5:18-20



- Is money/material wealth inherently bad?
 - God blessed many of his people with riches: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Job, etc.
 - It's a matter of perspective and priorities –
 Ecclesiastes



- Choose the right goal, and keep your eyes on that goal 1 Cor 9:23-27;
 2 Tim 4:6-8; Heb 12:1-3
- Choose the right companions –
 1 Cor 15:33; Amos 3:3
- Always be vigilant –
 1 Cor 10:12; Prov. 16:18



- Do not envy the people of the world Prov 24:1-2, 19-20
- Do not look back Num 11:4-5
- Remember where true value lies –
 2 Tim 6:6-7; Job 1:21
 - Your soul Matt 16:26; Mark 8:36; Matt 6:20
 - Your family
 - Christian fellowship



- Trust in God's promises Matt 6:25-34;
 Prov 3:7-10; Ps 37:25
- Do not become entangled in the material –
 2 Tim 2:3-4; 1 Tim 6:8
 - Do not develop a taste for the material Heb 11:24-25
 - Avoid debt and other worldly obligations –
 Prov 22:7; 2 Cor 6:14
 - Consider the influence of your friends



- When you need strength and faith:
 - Go to the source Rom 10:17
 - Ask for it Luke 17:5; 1 Cor 10:13
 - Go to the right people for help –
 Rom 14:19; 1 Thess 5:11; Prov 17:17;
 Prov 18:24
